

A BILL TO LIMIT DEATH ROW INMATES' APPEALS

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: A. Death row inmates residing in federal prisons shall be limited to a
3 maximum of three appeals.

4 B. Executions after the third appeal is denied shall be scheduled to occur
5 within one month of the failed appeal.

6 C. Current death row inmates will be allotted their three appeals at time of
7 passage.

8 Article II: A. Death row inmates shall be defined as inmates residing in federal
9 prisons awaiting execution.

10 B. Appeal shall be defined as an application to a higher court for a
11 decision to be reversed.

12 Article III: This bill will be put into effect 2 months after passage.

13 Article IV: The implementation of this bill shall be overseen by the Department of
14 Justice.

15 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall hereby declared null
16 and void.

A BILL TO SUBSTANTIALLY PRIVATIZE AMERICAN SPACE EXPLORATION

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: All government funding for space transportation and the development of
3 space technology shall be redirected to support private sector efforts.

4 Article II: The private sector, as defined here, consists of American-owned
5 corporations with relevant expertise and operations exclusively within the
6 United States.

7 Article III: This legislation will be implemented immediately.

8 Article IV: The National Aeronautics and Space Administration will implement and
9 administrate this legislation.

10 A. Funding will be distributed through means such as competitive
11 contracts for space transportation services and prizes for technical
12 accomplishments.

13 B. NASA will retain a regulatory and management role, and will remain
14 responsible for most space science efforts.

15 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO ENCOURAGE ALTERNATE DEVELOPMENT CROPS

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. Article I: The U.S. Federal Government will provide \$15 billion worth of aid to
3. farmers in countries chiefly responsible for narcotic production who farm
4. legitimate crops.
5. Article II: A. Countries that are chiefly responsible for narcotic production shall
6. be defined as Afghanistan, Pakistan, Columbia, and Mexico.
7. B. All farmers in all such countries are eligible for this aid program.
8. C. Legitimate crops shall be defined as any produce that can be
9. legally imported into the United States.
10. Article III: This bill shall take effect at the beginning of next fiscal year.
11. Article IV: USAID shall be responsible for the implementation of this piece of
12. legislation.
13. Article V: Any legislation in conflict with this bill will be declared null and void.

A BILL TO REFORM CONGRESSIONAL REDISTRICTING

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: Each State is hereby required to conduct all Congressional redistricting through
3 an independent commission. The State shall establish or designate a nonpartisan
4 agency to appoint the commission for each redistricting process. The process
5 must complete within 12 months of apportionment.

6 Article II: (A) “Nonpartisan agency” is an agency of the legislative branch that provides
7 services on a nonpartisan basis and is prohibited from advocating for the
8 adoption or rejection of any legislative proposal.

9 (B) 1/3 of the members of the “independent commission” come from a majority
10 pool, 1/3 from a minority pool, and 1/3 from an independent pool (“majority”
11 and “minority” referring to political parties). The nonpartisan agency develops
12 each applicant pool to be no less than 24 in size, then randomly selects the
13 members of the commission, no less than 9 in size.

14 (C) “Applicants” must be registered voters and, of the period of 3 years
15 immediately past, must be continuously affiliated with either their respective
16 political party or no party at all. Applicants may not be, or be an immediate
17 family member of: public officials, candidates for public offices, officials of a
18 political party, employees of a political campaign, registered lobbyists, or donors
19 of greater than \$10,000 to any particular political campaign. Applications must
20 include assurance of analytical expertise and a dedication to impartiality.

21 Article III: The above provisions will take effect immediately upon passage.

22 Article IV: The Department of Justice will enforce these provisions through civil action for
23 such relief as may be appropriate to carry out this bill.

24 Article V: All laws or portions of laws in conflict with the above provisions are hereby
25 declared null and void.

A BILL TO CONCLUDE POWER AFRICA

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. Article I: The United States shall halt all funding directed towards
3. Power Africa.
4. Article II: Power Africa shall be defined as the Department of State's foreign Aid
5. initiative aimed at building infrastructure to provide electricity to African
6. countries.
7. Article III: Upon passage, this bill shall be implemented immediately.
8. Article IV: The Department of State will dictate this piece of legislation in
9. concordance with the Department of the Treasury.
10. Article V: Any legislation in conflict with this bill will be declared null and void.
