

A BILL TO ENACT DACA AND DAPA

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: The Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, and the Deferred Action for
3 Parents of Americans and Lawful Permanent Residents will be enacted
4 into law. Persons who age out of DACA will be given the opportunity for
5 permanent residence. The funding for this program, levied through a
6 capping of tax deductions to 28 cents on the dollar for the top 3% of
7 earners, will be used to modernize and improve the immigration process.
8 Excess funding will be diverted back into the general reserve of tax
9 revenue.

10 Article II: The definition for “age out” shall be the same as specified in the existing
11 policy as announced in 2012.

12 Article III: This legislation will go into effect one month after the indicated process is
13 completed.

14 Article IV: The U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services, along with the U.S.
15 Immigration and Customs Agency and the Department of Homeland
16 Security will provide enforcement. The approval of the funding increase
17 will come from the Congressional Budget Office.

18 A. Modernization will include the subsidization of DACA and DAPA
19 application fees and the expansion of immigration courts.

20 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
21 void.

A RESOLUTION TO ENCOURAGE TURKEY’S REMOVAL FROM NATO

1 Whereas, President Erdogan has become increasingly authoritarian and has begun to
2 overstep civil rights within Turkey; and
3 Whereas, Erdogan’s actions have been brought into question both within Turkey and
4 abroad as he continues to arrest dissidents and those in the opposition; and
5 Whereas, Erdogan has used the failure of the recent coup in Turkey to replace and
6 arrest hundreds of Turkish officials; and
7 Whereas, Erdogan’s foreign policy has become increasingly unaligned and even
8 detrimental to that of the United States; and
9 Whereas, The United States cannot support nor align itself with a country that is
10 undemocratic and uncooperative toward the fight against terrorist threats
11 of the United States;
12 Therefore, be it resolved that the Congress here assembled heavily encourage and
13 actively pursue Turkey’s removal from the North Atlantic Treaty
14 Organization.

A BILL TO LEGALIZE EUTHANASIA

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: The United States federal government shall legalize the act of euthanasia of
3 terminally ill patients through the voluntary consumption of lethal medication as
4 prescribed by a physician.

5 Article II: Euthanasia shall be defined as the practice of intentionally ending life to relieve
6 pain or suffering. Terminally ill patients shall be defined as patients suffering
7 from an incurable and untreatable disease which will lead to the death of the
8 patient. The act will only be considered legal if these criteria are met:

9 A. The patient has made at least two verbal requests, separated by at least 7 days,
10 as well as a formal written request signed by the patient in the presence of the
11 prescribing physician and at least two witnesses.

12 B. The patient has received a psychological examination and been determined to
13 be mentally stable and capable of making unimpaired health care decisions.

14 C. It is agreed upon by the prescribing physician and at least two consulting
15 physicians that the prognosis is death, that there is no chance of recovery for
16 the patient, and that there are no remaining options for treatment of the
17 patient.

18 Article III: This bill shall take effect on September 1, 2017.

19 Article IV: This legislation shall be overseen by the U.S. Department of Health & Human
20 Services.

21 Article V: All laws in conflict with this bill are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO SECURE THE CYBERSPACE

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: The United States government shall increase military funding by 5% to be used
3 for improving cyber security.

4 Article II: Cyber security shall be defined as the protection of United States technologies,
5 processes, programs, and data in the context of internet security. This cyber
6 security shall protect U.S. technology interests throughout the world.

7 Article III: This bill shall be implemented on October 1, 2017.

8 Article IV: The Departments of the Treasury (DoT) and Defense (DoD) shall oversee the
9 distribution and allocation of the funds.

10 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation shall hereby be declared null and void.

A BILL TO SUBSIDIZE CRISPR RESEARCH AND USAGE IN HUMANS

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: The federal government shall use tax dollars to fund the research and
3 implementation of CRISPR technologies on human cells with the ultimate
4 goal of providing affordable gene-editing services for the American
5 public.

6 Article II: A. "Tax dollars" shall be defined as federal revenue collected from US
7 citizens.

8 B. "CRISPR," which stands for clustered regularly interspaced short
9 palindromic repeats and is a gene-editing tool, shall be defined as unusual
10 DNA sequences that protect organisms by identifying and attacking
11 viruses.

12 C. "Fatal diseases" shall be defined as potentially-deadly ailments
13 CRISPR has already been tested on, such as HIV, as well as future test
14 subjects, such as zika and cancers.

15 Article III: This bill shall take effect upon the renewal of the US's fiscal year in
16 September 2017.

17 Article IV: The Center for Disease Control and Prevention shall partner with publicly-
18 funded universities to carry out CRISPR research and human
19 implementation.

20 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall hereby declared null
21 and void.
