Tournament Director's Report

2023 Wrap-Up: Louisville, KY

The tournament went very smoothly:

- Thank you to all the KY CFL Leaders and Volunteers!
- Thank you to our hosts at U of L, Assumption, and Trinity Schools
- Thank you to all the Tab Chairs and Tab Staff!
 - Pleased to report there were NO errors this year
- Thank you to all the Coaches, Judges, and Students who helped us get through everything.

Numbers for Louisville 2023 compared to Louisville 2017 and DC 2022:

Dioceses – 63 vs 59, up from DC by 4 Schools – 412 vs 420, down from DC by 8 Students – 2051 vs 1973, up from DC by 78 Judges – 1168 vs 1161, up from DC by 7 Total People – 3219 vs 3134, up from DC by 85

We were at 75% of DC 2018 for DC 2022; and at 82% of LV 2017 for LV 2023 ... our target is 90-95% of Chicago 2014

Some Things We Need to Work On:

- We need to continue to work on ways to fully implement our "Open Door" Policy and handle Trigger Warnings.
- How to better implement Diversity-Enhanced Judge Panels
- We'll be convening our Tab Chairs and DEI Leaders to work through that this fall so we're ready for NCFL 2024.



Changes We'll Keep for 2024

- An Informational Diocesan Directors meeting will be held virtually on the Saturday before NCFL 2024, May 18.
- OnLine Judge Training and a Ballot Test may be held during the week preceding NCFL 2024.
- Equity & Bias Training for Judges may be made available during the week preceding NCFL 2024.
- A Two-Tiered OnLine "Start of Tournament" Registration approach, first for Leagues and then for Schools, may be held on Thursday and Friday of NCFL 2024, May 23 24.
- We will continue to skip the opening meetings like we did in DC 2022 & Louisville 2023 ... means we don't need big spaces and we can get started faster
- Use of FlipGrid to allow students to record their names to help with pronunciation during Awards

Finance Committee #1: School Fees

PASSED

Finance Committee Recommendation #1. Increase School Membership Fees to \$60.

Constitution, Article III, Section B, Paragraph 8.

The NCFL Annual School Membership Dues shall be \$50 (fifty \$60 (sixty dollars) per school with at least \$5 (five dollars) of the Dues going into NCFL savings.



Finance Committee #2: Site Visit

PASSED

Finance Committee Recommendation #2. Eliminate requirement for Exec Council to visit City.

Constitution, Article V, Section D, Paragraph 4.

The National Tournament Director and/or NCFL Event Planner shall conduct at least one site visit to the city hosting that year's Grand National Tournament. Either the Fall Executive Committee Meeting or the Winter Executive Council Meeting shall be hosted by the Diocesan League hosting that year's Grand National Tournament.



Finance Committee #3: Registration Fees \$75

Finance Committee Recommendation #3. Increase Tournament Registration Fees to \$75.

By-Laws, Article II, Section B, 2.

The fee levied for registration in the NCFL Grand National Tournament shall be \$75 \$60 per student staying in the designated NCFL Tournament Hotel Blocks.





Finance Committee #4: Out-Of-Block Fee

Finance Committee Recommendation #4. Increase the Out-Of-Hotel-Block Surcharge Fee.

By-Laws, Article II, Section B. 2.

For students not staying in the designated NCFL Tournament Hotel Blocks the fee will be double the registration fee \$110 per student staying in the Hotel Blocks.



Finance Committee #5: Late Fees

PASSEL

Finance Committee Recommendation #5. Increase the length of time for late registration to April 30 with a late fee per day.

By-Laws, Article II, Section B, 3.

Failure to register a Diocesan League for the Grand National Tournament by mail postmarked the date set and communicated by the Secretary/Treasurer will result in a fine of fifty twenty-five dollars (\$25 \$50.00) per day up for up to 15 7 days. The fine is assessed to the Diocesan League. After the 15 7th day, the League may not register for the Tournament and therefore may not compete that year.



By-Laws #1: Quotas

Proposal #1. To Change the Quotas - Erie & Pittsburgh, Susan Peebles & Beth Young

a Motion was passed to divide into two Motions A & B (divided by — here in minutes only) - later also divided out part C.

A - PASSED B - FAILED

See updated By-Laws for full NEW language (yes, it creates 2-10 schools with same quotas)

By-Laws, Article II – Grand National Tournament; Section B – Registration; 1. Quotas

a. Contestants: Entries from Diocesan Leagues in the tournament shall be governed by the following quota system based upon school membership in the LEAGUE:

2 Schools: 03 entries with no more than 1 in any event

3 Schools: 04 entries with no more than 1 in any event

4 Schools: 05 entries with no more than 1 in any event

2-5 Schools: 20 10 entries with no more than 2 1-in any event


6-10 Schools: 30 20 entrie with propose than 3 2 in any event

11-15 Schools: 40 30-en any event

16-20 Schools: 50 40 entrage of more than 5 4-in any event

21+ Schools: 60 50 entring than 6 5-in any event

26 + Schools: 60 entries of no le than 6 in any event



An individual school may have up to three entries, with no more than 1 entry in any event, one entry as an Independent School for one year only.



By-Laws #2: Freeze Quotas Again

Proposal #2. To Freeze the Quotas One Additional Year Erie & Pittsburgh, Susan Peebles & Beth Young



To extend the Emergency Powers of the NCFL Executive Council in the following manner: Keep the pre-pandemic quotas "frozen" at the canceled NCFL 2020 level for one additional year, for NCFL 2024, to encourage regrowth of programs and dioceses. As in prior years, Leagues can increase their quotas based on the number of school members, but they cannot have their quotas reduced regardless of the number of school members.

By-Laws #3: Policy Debate Double-Octos

Proposal #3. To adjust the criteria for clearing to Policy Debate Elimination Rounds Philadelphia, Chris Berdnik (Ashley)

By-Laws, Article II, Section C. 4 Debate Procedures. b, add ...

In Policy Debate, only entries earning at least 4 preliminary wins or at least 10 preliminary ballots will be eligible for Round VII (Double octo-final), up to a maximum of 32 teams.

By-Laws #4: Use of Timers in Extemp

Proposal #4. To limit the use of timing devices in Extemp NCFL Tournament Director

By-Laws, Article II, Section C. 1. Speech Events. c. Extemporaneous Speaking. 13. Add ...

While students may time themselves during their speech, the judges have the final decision on when time expires. If a student is using any handheld device other than a physical stopwatch or timer, such as a phone or tablet, they cannot hold the device, and must put it on a desk or a stand throughout the speech, and cannot touch or access the device during their speech.



By-Laws #5: Speech Ranks of 5

Proposal #5. To set "5" as the highest ranks allowed in Speech. NCFL Tournament Director

By-Laws, Article II, Section C. 2. Speech Events Procedures. a.

All speakers will compete in 4 rounds of a prearranged schedule. In each section of each prearranged round, there will be no more than 7 entries. Sections should be balanced to the greatest extent possible. No rank greater than "5" will be awarded, regardless of the number of entries in a section. At the end of the fourth round, the top 48 contestants in each event, based upon the low totals of all the judges in the four qualifying rounds, will be selected as octo-finalists.



By-Laws #6: Size of Congress Chambers

Proposal #6. To adjust the number of Chambers in Student Congress NCFL Tournament Director

By-Laws, Article II, Section C. 6 Student Congress. a,

The goal for the size of preliminary chambers will be 18 members. If there are 216 entries or less, as of 1 week prior to the Grand National Tournament, there will be 12 preliminary chambers. If there are more than 216 entries prior to the Grand National Tournament, then there will be an additional chamber added for every 18 entries above 216, or fraction thereof. Five members will advance from each Chamber to the Semi-Finals. Selection will be as defined in the NCFL Student Congress Manual.



By-Laws #7-1: Selection to Semi-Finals

<u>Proposal #7 - 1. Move By-Law items from Student Congress Manual to the By-Laws.</u>

By-Laws, Article II, Section C. 6. Student Congress a.

... Selection [from Semi-Finals to Finals] will be as defined in the Student Congress Manual. Based on the cumulative rankings from all Scorers (including each of the three Preliminary Sessions), the four top-ranking members of each chamber will advance to Semi-Finals. The Parliamentarian ranks all members of the chamber. The highest-ranking member of the chamber from the Parliamentarian ballot who has not already advanced based on Scorer ranks will also advance to Semi-Finals.



By-Laws #7-2: Selection to Finals

<u>Proposal #7 - 2. Move By-Law items from Student Congress Manual to the By-Laws.</u>

By-Laws, Article II, Section C. 6. Student Congress b.

... Selection [from Semi-Finals to Finals] will be as defined in the Student Congress Manual.

Based on the cumulative rankings from all Scorers, the five or seven (five if there are 4

Chambers, or 7 if there are 3 Chambers) top-ranking members of each chamber will advance to Finals. The Parliamentarian ranks all members of the chamber. The highest-ranking member of the chamber from the Parliamentarian ballot who has not already advanced based on Scorer ranks will also advance to Finals.



By-Laws #7-3: National Champion

<u>Proposal #7 - 3. Move By-Law items from Student Congress Manual to the By-Laws.</u>

By-Laws, Article II, Section C. 6. Student Congress c.

Selection to determine the National Champion will be as defined in the NCFL Student Congress Manual. The four Scorers and the Parliamentarian will rank the top 8 persons at the end of the Grand Final Session; each student unranked by an official will receive a rank of "9". The ranks will be totaled to determine the final placement. The ballot cast by the Parliamentarian in Preliminary, Semi-Final, and Grand Final Sessions will be used to break any ties that may occur.



Proposal #7-4: Semis Judges

<u>Proposal #7 - 4. Move By-Law items from Student Congress Manual to the By-Laws.</u>

By-Laws, Article II, Section C. 6. Student Congress d.

Semi-Finals and Grand Finals will consist of two two-hour sessions parts using the same panel of judges for each, with Presiding Officers elected for each.

<u>Proposal #7 - 5. Move By-Law items from Student Congress Manual to the By-Laws.</u>

Discussion Item #1: NCFL for Middle Schools

New Business Discussion Item #1. To allow NCFL Middle School NCFL Membership and to hold an NCFL Middle School National Online Tournament

LeAnne Schmidt, Detroit

Several schools and leagues have asked about NCFL supporting Middle School teams.

The Executive Council should develop rules for membership, and establish guidelines and a plan for running an NCFL Middle School National Online Tournament. Report back to the Fall Meeting 2024 recommending appropriate Constitution & By-Laws Amendments for implementation.



Discussion Item #2

New Business Discussion Item #2. Pieces approved/accepted by the Local Diocesan League, do not mean they are/will be accepted at the National Tournament.

The Protest Committee

The vast majority of our protests this year regarded using drama in prose. Our rules are clear and they put the onus on the coach/student to prove what they are reading is prose if questioned. I think the consensus of our group is that no changes in rules are needed. If there is a way to reinforce that coaches/students should read the rules of the events in which they qualify to Nationals - it would be great. But again I think we do all we can. Perhaps we need some statement that just because a piece goes through a qualifying tournament, it does not mean that the National rules have been applied. Getting through the Diocese is not a defense against protest at Nationals.

The use of a piece of literature in a Local Diocesan League tournament does not mean that National League rules have been applied to it. Getting through the Diocese with a piece is not a defense against protest at Nationals.



Discussion Item #3: "Single Work"

New Business Discussion Item #3. Definition of "single work" The Protest Committee

This is a fairness issue to which we need to give some thought. In the DP and DUO events when we indicate that the presentation should be from a "single published play," "single work," - do multiple episodes from a show meet our definition? As web shows get shorter and shorter - with multiple episodes providing the "rising action" "climax" and "falling action" - not to mention television series, etc. it is just a matter of time until we have to rule on this. Being able to select from multiple episodes would seem to give a competitor an unfair advantage over someone who sticks to one single episode. But a lot that is being written in series form - includes the "climax" in the 3rd or 4th episode of a 6 part series. Is BRIDGERTON a single work - or 16 single works (8 episodes over 2 seasons)?

Do cuttings that draw from multiple episodes and/or multiple seasons of the same show constitute a "single work" for the purposes of our definitions?



Discussion Item #4: Forms of Literature

New Business Discussion Item #4. Forms of "literature" The Protest Committee

There are always new sources being developed which may or may not fit our rules. The discussion came up about podcasts at Nationals - some of which are "dramatic" in nature and some of which are "informational."

Are there new sources of "literature" that we should be cognizant of?
